A MESSAGE FROM FOUNDER AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Happy 2025 to all!

This note is to share some of the successes Magnolia Memory Care has had in 2024 and give you an update on some changes we are facing in 2025. First, a reflection and celebration of accomplishments we achieved due to your generous support. We celebrated five years as a nonprofit and we are grateful to be recognized as one of the best dementia specific-respite programs in the area.

During a recent conversation with one of our participants, Ron shared that he

absolutely feels Minds Matter helps him every day to keep his mind sharp. You see, Ron, a retired teacher, prepared lesson plans and helped solve problems for his students for more than 30 years. When he realized his memory was declining, he enrolled in Minds Matter, attending three days a week. His wife says she can see a difference in his ability to engage and be more energetic, slowing down the progression of the disease.

Now to the changes we are facing for 2025. At our December Board meeting after much deliberation and discussion around a significant change in the market and rising costs to sustain the quality of Minds Matter, it was decided to pause operations of Minds Matter until we review our strategy moving forward about how to best serve our community in the current economic environment.

While this was a shock to most, and making this decision was difficult for everyone, it was the best move to protect the integrity, uniqueness, and excellent quality of our program. We will continue to offer Support Groups, Community outreach and 1:1 support to caregivers as needed.

Magnolia Memory Care, Inc., will use the next few months to reevaluate how we will move forward and will utilize the immediate future to continue to develop Minds Matter in the rural area of Lancaster as some of the money donated in 2024 supported providing services to under-served communities.

Families in this area struggle to know where to turn for help, or even understand the devastating financial and family stress from the impact of this diagnosis. The more we do as a community to demystify the stigmatism around dementia the more people we will continue to serve.

It is the hope of myself and the Board, that you trust our decision to re-group and re-evaluate next steps. It is an honor to serve along side this Board and our community. We will keep you abreast of our progress and ask that you keep us in your prayers. We could not have served all the families thus far without your generous support and for that, I am forever thankful!






